Workshops Activities KS1, KS2 and KS3 Local History, Life and Events.

Inspire the curiosity of your class. Help them to understand the complexity of people's lives, the process of change, the diversity and relationships between different groups in their own locality through time.

Changes within living memory.

Life in the Past: KS1

Taking a fun ride on a Charabanc : Children play out a trip to the seaside with lots of hats to wear and things to carry we sing old songs and look at life and leisure in the more recent past, with some clothes, photos and artefacts to handle.



Homes in the past: Handling artefacts to guess the use of and looking at local family images with worksheets to use.

Toys and Games: songs, rhymes and ring games.

Wash day: KS1

Scrubbing, dunking, wringing and folding, children use the old fashioned methods and materials to get some idea of what a job it was to get the washing clean. With someartifacts and clothes from the past to see and handle.



Change in Yate: KS 1/2

The story of the growth of Yate with images, maps and artefacts to handle.

Significant Event of National Importance

WW2 in Yate: KS 2/3

ROLE PLAY. Land Girls, Home Guard, Factories and Evacuees, all have identity cards and Ration books to play their part +artifacts.



The Parnall Workpass Fragment: KS 2/3

A Teacher's Resource of the WW 2 bombing of the local aircraft factory story. With supporting material from British and German sides and ideas for further teaching and links.

Events beyond living memory

Workhouse Experience: KS 1/2 ROLE PLAY

Children explore the stark reality of being a workhouse child in Yate in a personal way. Each child id given an actual identity from the 1901census telling something of the individual stories, the children experience the life at work and play.

Rich and Poor: KS1/2

ROLE PLAY. Life for the Victorian Mining Family and Life in the Big House. Exploring the contrast between two families using artefacts, images and clothes, the children act out 'a day in the life.'
